The new booking system at the mount is helping to provide a better experience for visitors. Local's passes available to allow access.

St Aubyn's are working to reopen friendship woods which was also damaged in the storm.</p> <p>Solar planning is ongoing and has gone to the planning committee had a site visit on the 18th March going back to the committee the week after next. Grid connection for the solar has passed review. St Aubyn also have a battery storage system planned for the solar installation. Work is also starting on three commercial units within the parish. Will be cleaning up a current eyesore derelict building. No other planning or development planned at this time. Other than that the portfolio is in a good state. Fuel costs will affect the farming sector quite badly. Three months behind due to storm damage..</p> <p>Discussed various including, footpaths, drainage at long rock Allotments and possibly increasing the size of the allotments.. Coastal resilience strategy has been circulated. St Aubyn has been asked to top up sand at the beach at Marazion as part of the coastal resilience strategy.</p>
