LPC26.27.126	<p><b>John Martin</b> – JM raised that there are a lot of projects going ahead despite community opposition such as the recent solar farm approval. He also informed LPC of the delay to the heliport planning meeting until July. Brought up that the heliport want to vary the conditions in order to make a profit and remain a viable business.</p> <p>JM also highlighted that the new National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) will, he believes, result in a far less democratic process of scrutiny. He has also promised to keep LPC informed on upcoming discussions of devolution for cornwall.</p> <p>There was also a discussion of Varfell farm applying for a new license to allow for more goods lorries.</p> <p><b>Juliet Line</b> – Stated that the heliport technical briefing was a good opportunity for applicants to make their case and for Cllrs to push back against the heliport's arguments. JL states that they are varying the conditions not clarifying them as the heliport state. The Heliport has offered a visit to Cllrs and affected residents on an informal basis. JL will set a date for them to meet residents. JL further states that the current conditions are not an existential threat to the heliport. She also highlighted that locals on both Scilly and Penzance are complaining that helicopters are not following the flightpath.</p> <p>JL also raised concerns over the coastline housing development adjacent to Polmor road/ Tregender road. She cites the residents concerns over access issues and the increased flood risk the site may cause. JL has called the development into committee so that the issues with the development can be properly discussed.</p>

	JL also informed LPC that Cornwall Council's road safety strategy has been approved by cabinet. CC will work proactively with vision zero to try and reduce road deaths in Cornwall. JL also mentioned improved maintenance to improve the safety of the road network and increased enforcement powers over pavement parking.

LPC26.27.132	<p>Laura Miucci – Proposal to re-establish the Ludgvan Old Cornwall Society. LM is the archaeology officer on behalf of the Federation of Old Cornwall Societies. She is also a local resident of Ludgvan Parish.</p> <p>The purpose of her visit is to invite LPC to support the re-launch of the Ludgvan Old Cornwall Society, consider providing LOCS a small start up grant nearer to the launch and to offer ongoing partnership support, including publicity and collaboration on heritage matters.</p> <p>The Old Cornwall movement was founded in 1920 and now includes over 40 societies across Cornwall. LOCS was originally founded in 1986 and was active until 2013.</p> <p>Previously they restored Tregallast Well in 2001 along with other community heritage projects, talks and walks. All the documents from the society are now held in Kresen Kernow.</p> <p>LM states that given the renewed interest in local heritage and Cornish identity means that it is the right moment to bring it back.</p> <p>A reestablished LOCS would provide the following benefits.  Monitoring of heritage assets and reporting of issues with them.  Providing historical context for planning proposals.  Helping to ensure sites are on the Historic Environment Record.</p> <p>There are numerous examples of similar Old Cornwall Societies working with local councils. Examples include Treverbyn parish council, St Gerrans &amp; Porthscatho OCS and st Endellion Parish council. Ludgvan OCS could work with the active Ludgvan Church Facebook Group to act as partners to safeguard the archaeological and built heritage of Ludgvan as well as intangible Cornwall Heritage practices.</p>
